# VATICAN II AS THE FIRST SOURCE OF CCEO CANONS

## Cherian Thunduparampil, CMI\*

Cherian Thunduparampil making a survey of CCEO canons identified the following facts: It is not surprising to realize that in accordance with the vision of John XXIII and the interest of his successor Paul VI, 15 out of the 16 Vatican Documents have functioned as the source and inspiration of of the CCEO canons. 1. Titles of CCEO without any Reference to Vatican II Cited as Source and Inspiration; 2. Vatican Documents as Sources of CCEO; 3. Vatican Document which is not Cited as Source of CCEO; 4. How many Canons Mention Vatican Council II as Source?

#### Introduction

In 1959 when he announced convening the Council, John XXIII had three projects in mind: i) a Diocesan Synod for Rome, ii) the convocation of an Ecumenical Council, and iii) the reform of the laws

of the Church as norms and guidelines are necessary for action and implementation of the Church's teachings. In the preamble to the "Guidelines for the Revision of the Code of Oriental Canon Law", which were approved at the First Plenary Assembly of the Commission of the March 18-23 1974" we read: "One of the most effective ways of implementing the "aggiornamento" of the Church, as desired and decreed by the Second Vatican Council is by the revision of the Code of Oriental Canon Law carried out in accordance with the principles and spirit of the same council." Paul VI addressed the Plenary assembly: Vatican II is to be the loadstar of the Eastern Code. On this occasion of the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Vatican Council II, by making a survey of CCEO, I want to identify the canons for which Vatican II is cited in the first place as a source.

In this process apparently CCEO, c. 2 presents a question because according to it, "The canons of the code, in which ancient law of the Eastern Churches has been mostly received or adapted, are to be assessed chiefly by that law." This canon poses the problem of understanding the role of the ancient law: is ancient law to be the standard to judge the canons of the whole code? Or only those canons in which ancient law is cited are to be assessed by that law? In the formulation of the canons of CCEO, in fact, we can note a beautiful blend of the ancient laws or the sacred canons and the integration of the renewed theological and ecclesiological vision of Vatican II in order to make both the teachings of Vatican II and the laws more relevant to the present day.

# 1. Titles of CCEO without any Reference to Vatican II as Source and Inspiration

Of the thirty titles of CCEO only in the following eight instances we do not notice any explicit mention of Vatican II Documents as the source and inspiration.

# 3. Vatican Document which is not Cited as Source of CCEO

Only one out of the total sixteen Documents of Vatican II has not been mentioned explicitly as the source and inspiration of CCEO, that is,

## 4. How many Canons Mention Vatican Council II as Source?

Of the 1546 canons of CCEO a total of 262 canons have been inspired by the teachings of Vatican II. Here below are presented those canons. Repeated mention of the same document in the different paragraphs of the same canon has not been indicated separately. In 191 canons Vatican II is cited in the first place as their source and in the other 71 instances reference is made but not in the first place.

### Conclusion

We can say that the Revision commission for the codification of the Oriental Canon Law has done justice to the vision of Pope John XXIII and the interest of his successors to reform the laws of the Church and to do it in accordance with the teachings of Vatican Council II. All documents of Vatican II except one have been seriously considered in the codification process and thus 191 out of the 262 canons mentioned about cite Vatican II in the first place as their source.
